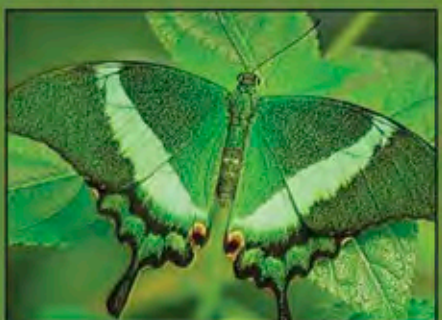

The Cecil B. Day Butterfly Center features more than 1,000 tropical butterflies representing over 50 species. Approximately 120 species of tropical plants provide an oasis for these magnificent creatures as they freely fly about in one of North America's largest glass-enclosed, tropical butterfly conservatories.

Every visit to the Day Butterfly Center is a new experience because this is a living, growing environment where the plant population changes over time and the butterfly population fluctuates in diversity and density.

The Day Butterfly Center's lobby includes a variety of artwork generously donated by Deen Day Sanders, who also made the primary gift used to build the center in honor of her late husband, Cecil B. Day, founder of Days Inn of America, Inc. The award-winning film, "On Wings of Wonder," plays continuously in high-definition in the center's theater, educating visitors about the miraculous life cycle of butterflies. A daily presentation, "Butterflies 101," features one of our butterfly experts discussing all aspects of butterfly life inside and outside the Day Butterfly Center.
