GARDENS SPOTLIGHT

As you travel through the gardens, be sure to watch for:

- Large-flowered Pansies of varying colors as well as winter annuals in beds located throughout the Gardens.
- Popular ornamental Witch Hazel has bright yellow to orange-red, spidery petals in the Callaway Brothers Azalea Bowl and Meadowlark Gardens.
- Daphne, a small evergreen shrub with white or light pink flowers blooming in small clusters. You'll smell their heavenly fragrance along the Rhododendron Trail, in the Overlook Azalea Garden and at the Callaway Brothers Azalea Bowl.
- An evergreen vine with fragrant, bright yellow flowers called Carolina Jessamine is at the entrance of the Callaway Discovery Center and in the Meadowlark Gardens.
- Bluebirds beginning to scout for nesting locations, Spring peepers beginning to call at night, and purple martins arriving from their Winter homes in South America.
- A self-guided walk on the Lady Bird Johnson Wildflower Trail in the Meadowlark Gardens is extra special in February as it's the best time of year to see early-blooming wildflowers, or spring ephemerals.
- Quince, Oriental Magnolias, Camellias, and Winter Honeysuckle also are in bloom.
